A Note from Jamie

Dear Members and Friends of First Parish,

I want to say a big thank you to everyone who has joined me for one of my informal chats in January/February or welcomed me to visit your small group. I have a few small group gatherings remaining in March, and then, when all is said and done, I will have met with over one hundred and fifty FP members and friends. Through all these gatherings I've been privileged to get to know you better, hear and answer your questions, and learn more about your hopes and concerns for First Parish. It has been invaluable. It has also been a lot of fun. Thank you!

A big topic of conversation is always the religious education program, which is very important to First Parish. I imagine after the unexpected departure of Lisa Maria, our Director of Faith Development for Children, you may have wonderings about what comes next. I wanted to use this space to give you some information and some reassurances.

The reassurances part: First, as Lisa Maria expressed in her goodbye letter, her departure is not a reflection on First Parish. She made the hard decision to leave FP to pursue an opportunity that is more beneficial for her family, which I think we can all understand. I am happy for her that she had that opportunity, and, of course, sad for us. She has had nothing but positive things to say about First Parish, our community, our kids and families, and her time with us.

The second reassurance: Rev. Annie and I have met and gone over the needs of the RE program for the rest of the year to make sure everything is covered and programming will continue uninterrupted. Things are in good shape and good hands. Rev. Annie put out a request for some extra volunteer support, and many of you have already responded. Thank you! If you have any questions or concerns about the spring or summer programs, please reach out to me or Rev. Annie.

Now I wanted to give you some information about next steps. Rev. Annie and I met with Sarah Dorer (your Board President) and Bob Dorer (Personnel Committee) to review the hiring process and timeline. Any time there is a staff departure it is an opportunity to review staffing holistically and rethink how the needs of the congregation might best be met. As a part of that, we are having multiple listening sessions to learn more about what those needs are. The first listening session, for parents with children and youth currently in the RE program, is Friday March 8, from 6-8pm. Food and childcare will be provided. The second listening session, for RE volunteers more generally and people who have recently had children and youth in the program, will be March 17, right after church. We want to hear from people actively engaged with the RE program what your wants, needs, and hopes for the program are.

Armed with that information, and after our own thoughtful review of the program and the overall needs of the church, Rev. Annie and I will present a range of staffing options to the Board for consideration. This could include hiring a traditional DRE, a Director of Family Ministry, an RE Coordinator, a volunteer coordinator and outreach specialist, or some mix of the above. We have mapped out some initial possibilities to start thinking about. Your input will help us get to a recommendation and a final decision. Of course, what is possible will also depend on the budget and the success of the pledge drive.

We hope to have our staffing determination made at the March Board meeting. Once we know exactly what we are hiring for, we will convene a search team or a hiring task force, advertise the position(s), and go through the hiring process in April. Our assumption is we are hiring for a start day of August 1.

Underlying all of this process is our commitment to support and grow the religious education program at First Parish, support our families, and support the community. The Religious Education program is a core mission of First Parish. I believe it is one of the most important things we do. I am looking forward to working with our talented staff, and with all of you, to bring that program into the next phase of its life at First Parish.

March is a busy month at First Parish, with lots of wonderful events ahead (Bi-Annual Cabaret, Irish Celebration, Rev. Jamie's Installation Service, etc...). We also have some beloved Spring events already on our radar, like the Talents & Treasures Auction and the 68th Annual Plant & Craft Fair.

With the preparations underway for these festivities, there may be an increased need for booking rooms/Zooms for your meeting. In order to better serve you, please contact Stacey (skatz@uubedford.org) at least 3-5 business days in advance so we have plenty of time to schedule heat/air-conditioning (here's hoping!). And we ask the same for booking a Zoom meeting. Please reach out to me at parishadministrator@uubedford.org at least 3-5 business days in advance.

Given some of these events will involve tasty treats and beverages, I wanted to take this time to remind everyone of our <u>food policy</u> with regards to Memorial Services, receptions, parties, etc.... Below please find the details:

- Leftover perishable foods can only be served to children/youth the same day;
- Common allergen food labels in bowl/basket to be put out with foods being served to reduce accidental
 consumption;
- Provide communication to internal/external groups that all food must be removed after the event, with the exception of packaged food or one medium tray per item (i.e. one vegetable tray, one fruit tray, etc...);
- Tape/marker will be left in the kitchen for easy labeling of dates on food;
- Ice cream related toppings need to be checked for expiration dates so they don't pile up.

Lastly, once again, please find below an explanation of our three email lists for use by the First Parish community. Please contact me with your preferred email address if you would like to be added to any of the lists. We ask that you be mindful of each of their uses, and please remember to be kind and respectful with your communications.

- <u>Parish Business (ParishBiz) List</u> communicates important news and events from FP staff and leadership to the parish. We encourage all Parishioners to subscribe to ParishBiz.
- <u>Announcement (Anno) List</u> used to *facilitate* announcements of news and events of general interest to the community (i.e. Does anyone know a good chiropractor?).
- <u>Discussion (Disc) List</u> a means of promoting (*or responding to*) the discussion of issues of general interest to the community.

News from the Parish Board

I want This month we would like to focus on three different ways for us to continue our stewardship of First Parish in March.

- **#1). Rev. Jamie's Installation Service: Saturday, March 23, 2024.** Please join us for Jamie's Installation Service at 3pm in the Sanctuary or on Zoom. As mentioned in last month's Parishioner, an Installation Service for a new, called minister celebrates the covenantal relationship between the minister and the congregation with a spoken ritual that involves all who are present. Be on the lookout for requests for help from the members of the Installation Planning team as well as the Zoom link if you are not able to attend in person. (*Please see the flyer further in this newsletter for more details.*)
- **#2). Financial Stewardship of First Parish.** March marks the month in the church calendar when the Stewardship Team comes before the parish with the request for financial pledges for the next church fiscal year. Most of the money we need to provide the ministries, music programs, children and youth programs, office administration and physical plant upkeep that we have come to value and expect comes directly from us each year. Last year, we had a very successful stewardship drive reaching 94% of our goal with pledges totaling \$515,000. It was a complicated ask as we were moving to a 13-month fiscal year for FY '23-'24 to get us in better alignment with our church year. The percent increase that we asked for last year merely covered that extra month as well as a portion of staff compensation increases that had been recommended by the UUA. This year, the Parish Board has set a goal of \$560,000 for next year yes, an ambitious goal, we know! We have some significant physical plant needs that must be attended to as well as pay the next portion of our staff compensation. Our plan is for two full-time ministers and to continue faith development programming for children, youth and adults with staffing. Please pay close attention to the literature from the Stewardship Team, the presentation from Vicki Gaw, our treasurer, on Sunday, March 10 and the messages from our ministers and parishioner testimonials. The budget that we pass in June for next year will be dependent on what we pledge later this month. Thank you in advance for your generosity!
- #3). GA (General Assembly) June 20 23. Calling all who are interested in becoming a delegate from First Parish this year. GA is the annual gathering of Unitarians and Universalists to conduct the business of the Association. The General Assembly will be entirely virtual this year with the option of participating either as a Fully Registered participant (feebased) or a Business-only participant (donation). First Parish is entitled to send 7 delegates. The church has budgeted money for the registration fee and the sooner you commit, the cheaper it will be. Among other agenda items, delegates will be voting on the proposed revision to Article II of the UUA Bylaws. "If you don't like the road you're walking, start paving another one." – comment made in 2014 by country singer, songwriter, musician, entrepreneur and activist, Dolly Parton (b. 1946)

Here's the planned music for 10 a.m. (unless otherwise noted) services in the upcoming month –

Sunday, March 3rd: Steve Sussman will be playing the piano.

Sunday, March 10th: Sandra LaBarge-Neumann will be playing organ. The music for the service will salute International Women's Day with 3 compositions by women composers/arrangers/editors: the prelude will be a beautiful choral piece by Renaissance composer Josquin des Prez edited by our very own Buffie Groves; the very special offertory will be sung by the treble voices of the adult choir conducted by Sandra and will be a charming choral piece entitled "March" by composer/performer Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel, the sister of famed German composer Felix Mendelssohn; and the postlude will be an organ piece, *Larghetto* by Swedish organist, composer and conductor Elfrida Andrée. It will be a noteworthy morning of music honoring very talented women.

Sunday, March 17th: Sandra LaBarge-Neumann will be playing organ.

Saturday, March 23rd "Jamie Hinson-Rieger's Installation Service": (3 p.m.) Sandra LaBarge-Neumann will be playing organ and Steve Sussman will be playing the piano. There will be special songs and music selected by Rev. Jamie. The music will include Cynthia Mork singing the prelude and the adult choir will sing "Seasons of Love" from Jonathan Larson's groundbreaking musical, "Rent". I hope you will make a special effort to attend this significant event in honor of Rev. Jamie.

Sunday, March 24th: Steve Sussman will be playing the piano.

Friday, March 29th "Tenebrae/Good Friday" (7 p.m.): As I always say, this is one of my favorite services of the year. I know many others at First Parish echo that feeling. There will be an hour long story-type service encompassing many of the customary Tenebrae/Good Friday themes. To enhance the proceedings, the adult choir will sing music by Baroque composers – two works J.S. Bach ("Sheep May Safely Graze" and "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring", the latter arranged by Dean Groves), Antonio Vivaldi ("Et in terra pax" from his famous "Gloria") and 3 choruses from Georg Frideric Handel's "Messiah". On organ Sandra LaBarge-Neumann will play Bach's famous masterpiece, "O Mensch, bewein dein' Sünde gross". Steve Sussman will be there accompanying on piano as well as Carlough Faulkner Carroll – violin, Melinda Ballou – viola, Nathan Kimball – cello, Carol Epple – flute and Elizabeth Connors – clarinet. "O Sacred Head, now wounded" will also be sung. Combining tradition with a touch of unconventionality, this will be a service of shadows and deep reflection. Be sure to bring a stone with you.

Sunday, March 31st "**Easter**": For both the 9 a.m and 11 a.m. services, Sandra LaBarge-Neumann will be playing organ and Steve Sussman will be playing piano. At the 9 a.m. service, the prelude will feature Nao Okamoto – violin playing the famous *Intermezzo* from Italian composer Pietro Mascagni's "*Cavalleria Rusticana*" and will be danced by Dorothy Anderson-Perales. The adult choir, joined by Carol Epple and Elizabeth Connors, will sing the "Easter Hymn" also from the same work. At the 11 a.m. service, Natan Wythe will be leading the First Parish youth choirs in joyous music appropriate to the celebratory mood. During both services we will also sing expected hymns for the day. Don't forget to wear your Easter bonnets!

Let's celebrate the return of the First Parish Cabaret! Produced by our youth choirs director, Natan Wythe, the Cabaret will be on **Saturday evening, March 2, 2024** at **7 p.m.** A flyer with more information is elsewhere in this Parishioner and on the First Parish website: www.uubedford.org. While it may be a little late to sign up to perform in the show, please come to the performance and support Natan and our youth! The net proceeds will benefit First Parish.
